

March's recovery haul was 85 with a value of £1.67m. Amongst the haul was a good spread of trucks, bikes and caravans but plant stole the show, accounting for 18% of the total volume.

The most valuable recovery was a £120,000 Mercedes CL63 AMG stolen in London. Cars known to have been stolen with keys accounted for 80% of car recoveries this month.

To prove that 'where there's muck there's brass', the oddball recovery for March was that of a Thetford waste compactor valued at £40,000 and very hard to steal.
